This is an open book test to be completed by the team members who are entered in the 2024 Roadeo competition. The purpose of this test is to measure and increase your knowledge of transporting students with disabilities and preschoolers. As you consult the written resources and the websites that this document recommends as sources for answers to the test questions, you will learn more about the issues, solutions, organizations, government entities, and people involved in special needs transportation.

This test consists of five (5) sections:

Section I: Five multiple-choice questions worth 25 points

Section III: Ten true/false questions worth 10 points **Section III:** Five matching questions worth 25 points

Section IV: Five fill in the blank questions worth 15 points

Section V: One essay question worth 25 points*
